The Warrior girls golf team was in action Tuesday as they teed off against Brandon Valley and Lennox at the municipal course in Lennox.

Turning in a team score of 178—compared to 193 by Brandon and 276 by Lennox—the Warrior girls dominated the competition.

Junior Chelsea Cadwell won the meet, shooting a 40. Senior Myrissa Blades shot a 41.

On Wednesday the city girls golf meet also began at Westward Ho. WHS shot a solid 183, which put them in second place. O'Gorman shot a 175 to earn first place, while Lincoln came in third with a 204 and Roosevelt fourth with a 214.

Cadwell again led the Warriors, shooting a 40, which put her in second place overall. Other WHS scorers included Blades with a 43, sophomore Keni Nelson with a 46 and junior Ashley Schaefer with a 54.

### Boys Tennis

The Warrior boys tennis team edged the Yankton Bucks in a close 5-4 match Tuesday in Yankton.

In varsity singles action the Warriors found wins with junior Jared Drenkow, senior James Feinstein and freshman Nolan Hazard. In doubles, Drenkow-Feinstein won 6-4, 6-3, and Hazard-sophomore Austin Snyder won 6-3, 4-6, 7-5. The Warriors will next compete today against Vermillion in Vermillion.

### Baseball

The Warrior varsity baseball team competed in a doubleheader with the Lincoln Patriots

Tuesday at the Harmodon Complex.

The Warriors fell to the Patriots in both games, losing the first 14-13 and the night cap 1-0.

The varsity will next be in action against Yankton at 1 p.m. Saturday at Harmodon.

### Track and Field

On Tuesday the varsity track team competed in a meet with Brandon Valley, O'Gorman, Lincoln and Yankton in Yankton.

Winning for the Warriors in individual girls track events was junior Chelsey Wahlstrom in the 800 meter dash with a time of 2:26.6. In varsity girls field events senior Jenna Schmidt dominated, taking first in the high jump and triple jump.

In boys events the 4x400 4x800 relay teams came out on top with times of 3:31.7 and 8:24.3, respectively.

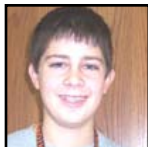
