 "Once a Warrior, Always a Warrior" blankets can be ordered for \$35 from Jorgenson in A-141. Orders are due by April 10.

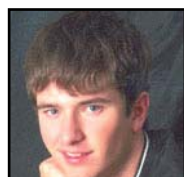
McCoy, Krege named royalty
