During halftime of the WHS game, the Highsteppers will be performing their competitive hip hop routine featuring over 20 WHS boys and girls.

The event will also feature a concert by Kory and the Fireflies during halftime of the second game, as well as a concert after the games until 11:30 p.m.

Hurricane John hits Mexico's west coast

PUERTO VALLARTA, Mexico (AP)—Hurricane John pummeled Mexico's resort-studded Pacific Coast with winds and rain Thursday, plotting a course that could take its eye close to land before nicking the tip of Baja California.
