•**Thoughts about coming to WHS:** "I had the opportunity to student teach last fall, so I had an idea of what was going on.



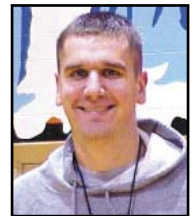
I love the students and the staff is very welcoming. I feel right at home here at WHS."

Ritter said the team just needs to come together tonight to win.

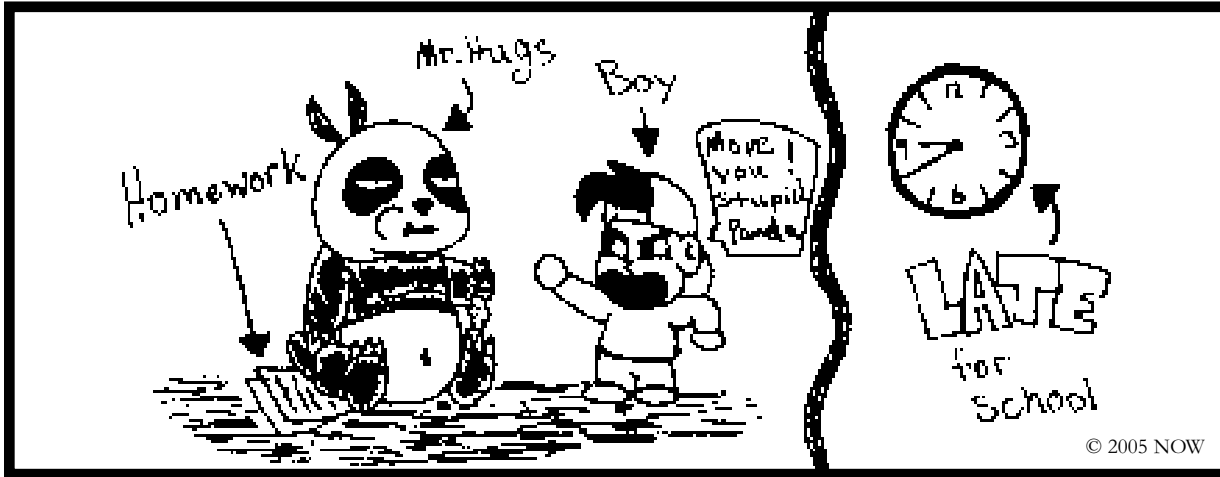
"If the team can play together, I think we will come out victorious," Ritter said. "It would be great to see a large crowd to cheer us on."
