Saturday evening at 5 p.m. at Howard Wood Field the Warriors will face the O'Gorman Knights in the 12th annual Presidents' Bowl extravaganza.

The game is the first of two on the night, as Lincoln faces Roosevelt at 8 p.m. Admission to both games is \$6, no activity passes are accepted for the game.

Tailgating activities will begin at around 3 p.m. Other pre-game events include a presentation by the S.D. Army National
