Sophomore Trevor Mathison said he feels the team has been playing extremely well.

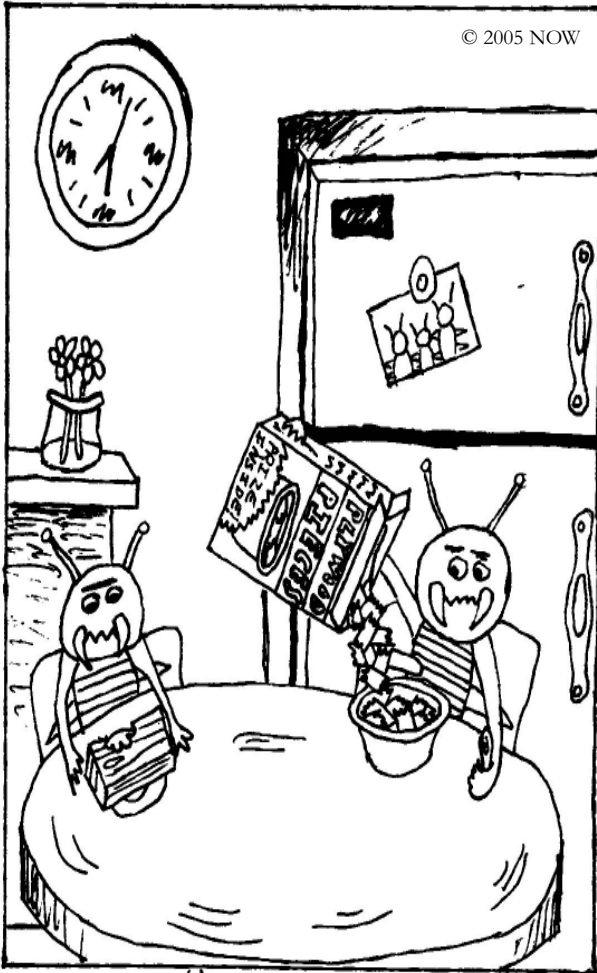
"Everyone on the team has been contributing consistent scores on a regular basis, allowing us to keep a large lead in the tournament," Mathison said.
