The 4-7 varsity Warrior volleyball team will have their next game on Tuesday in Pipestone, Minn.

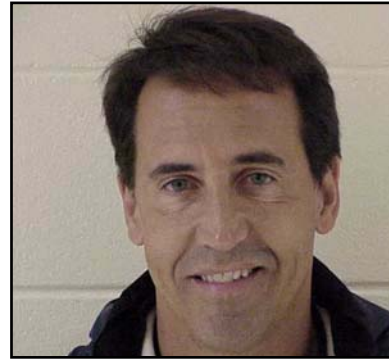
