Warriors advance to quarterfinals with 42-14 win over Lincoln Pats

The Warriors dominated the Lincoln Patriots 42-14 in the opening round of the 11AA football playoffs Thursday at Howard Wood Field.

The game was the nightcap to a doubleheader. In the opening game, the Roosevelt Rough Riders pounded the Brookings Bobcats 27-7.

Junior Ryan Routh scored the first touchdown for the Warriors near the middle of the first quarter, scoring on a 75-yard run.

Coach Kim Nelson said he is proud of the way his team played.

"I'm happy to win, and am looking forward to the game against O'Gorman on Tuesday," Nelson said. "Our defense

played hard, and I'm glad we are able to keep running the ball late in the season when it is needed most."

The Warriors will face O'Gorman in the next round Tuesday in another 8 p.m. game at Howard Wood Field. Roosevelt will host Stevens at 5 p.m.

"Stopping O'Gorman's running game and taking care of the ball will be the key strategies next game," Nelson said.

Others scoring for the Warriors in the 42-14 victory were senior Mitch O'Connor on a 36 yard run, senior Tim Ryan on a 10 yard pass from junior Layne Larson, senior JaRon Harris on a 41 yard pass from senior Justin Thompson, junior Lee Metzger on an eight yard run, and freshman quarterback Jordan Lakatos on a one-yard dash.

- What was your favorite Halloween costume ever? When I was 7, I dressed up as the Lone Ranger. I think



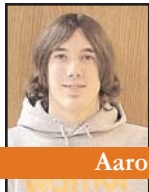

SNL is a sketch-comedy show that has been a fixture on NBC (KDLT, channel 46, cable 5 in Sioux Falls) since 1975. The template for countless late night shows since, the cast of the show has changed several times. SNL has been the highest rated late-night show in the
