Senior Tommy Banouvang encourages everyone to attend the event.

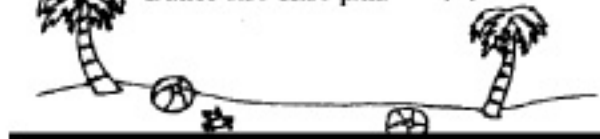
"The variety show acts are very exciting and the student council skits look good," Banouvang said. "The dance will be fun and everyone should attend because it is the last dance of the year."

Elmer Hansen track meet set for Saturday

The fourth annual Warrior Invitational Track Meet will be held from 10 a.m.-5 p.m. Saturday at Howard Wood Field.

Among those competing will be seven large schools, and nine smaller schools.

The event, named for former WHS track coach Elmer Hansen, was canceled last year due to inclement weather, so this year will actually be the

third running of the event hosted by WHS.

The Warrior track teams hope to set some new meet records in what has been, so far, a stand-out season for the teams. The Warriors hold the meet record in events including the 300-meter hurdles, 800 dash and long jump and hope to establish additional meet records this year.

Coach Mike Peiper said he is looking forward to

Saturday's competition.

"All of the Division A schools are always good competition," Peiper said. "We always like to compete at Howard Wood. It's a great facility."

Saturday's event also provides one of only three more opportunities for the Warriors to qualify for the State AA Track Meet, set for May 30 in Sturgis and May 31 in Rapid City.
