## Sioux Falls high school students required to wear identification

WHS students will join high school students at Roosevelt and Lincoln in wearing identification badges during school hours this year under a requirement passed by the Sioux Falls School Board.

Specific guidelines were developed by each school. WHS's guidelines are printed here and are available from ad-room teachers.

Students who do not wear their badge will face consequences. For the first offense, the student will be given a warning and a temporary ID sticker. The first offense will also be noted in the office.

The second offense will result in a detention. The student will be given a temporary sticker and will also be sent to study hall and receive a zero for all class

work for that period.

Offenses three and four will result in two or three detentions and the student will be sent to study hall and receive a zero for any missed classroom work.

Offenses beyond the fourth offense can result in suspension.

Assistant principal Dale Veatch said the ID badge program is modeled after another long-time program at WHS.

"We are handling the ID badges no differently then the way we handled the sweeps," Veatch said.

Senior Anna Brown said she thinks the program is too tough on students.

"It's all a little harsh for just a piece of plastic," Brown said.

Senior Theo Mattick said he thinks the program will work.

"I think it's a great idea," Mattick said. "It will keep everyone in line."

### Official guidelines

1. Students must wear the badge in a visible manner at the waist or above.
2. Students will not need the ID to enter the building. Students will be required to wear the badge to enter class and throughout the day.
3. Students will be allowed to use a clip or lanyard to display their ID badge. Students are provided one lanyard with their ID. Students may appropriately decorate their lanyard or provide their own lanyard.
4. ID badges may not be displayed on backpacks, purses, coats, etc. Emergency situations may require that students leave such items in the classroom.
5. ID badges should not be altered or defaced in any way. (i.e. stickers, written markings, photo alterations, mutilation, etc.)
6. Properly displayed ID badges are necessary for admittance into WHS classrooms. Teachers are directed to send students without their ID badge to the office.
7. Students will need their ID badge to eat lunch and check materials out of the library. Students without an ID, regular or temporary, will not be allowed through lunch line until they get an ID from the office. Students will also need to show their ID for admittance to school dances.
8. Students are to notify the office immediately if they lose their ID. Replacement ID's will be provided for a \$5 fee. Students who report a lost or stolen ID will not receive a consequence; they will only need to pay the replacement fee. The office will notify the cafeteria of lost ID's.
