Warriors open season with win over Rapid City Central

Warrior varsity football team members kicked-off their season with a Greater Dakota Conference win over the Rapid City Central Cobblers 24-7 Friday at O'Harra Field in Rapid City.

The Warriors got off to a quick start when senior JaRon Harris ran the opening kickoff 90 yards for a touchdown. Later in the first quarter, Harris also scored on a 27-yard interception return.

Junior Ryan Routh also scored a touchdown in the first quarter, rounding out the Warrior touchdowns. Senior Chris Hansen also added a 40-yard field goal in the third quarter.

Senior Luke Sharpe said the team was excited about the first game of the season.

"We practiced for two weeks and we really wanted the season to get going," Sharpe said.

Senior Colin Zdenek said he thought the game went well, but the team needs to work on some things.
